

Phil King's 'Just Me' an entertaining listen from start to finish

The first time I listened to Phil King's album "Just Me," I was in the car with my 12-yearold son, Ben. He asked me if the music was by another one of my friends — by now, he's used to me bringing home CDs by local musicians.

I told him it was Phil King and that it Music

was country music. After a few minutes, said, Ben "This isn't

country music." "What makes you say that?" I shot back.

"It's not boring," he said. And there you have it wisdom and honesty only a 12year-old can deliver.

Furthermore, he's right. "Just Me" is anything but bor-ing. Its 10 tracks fit together nicely, making for a CD that is entertaining from start to finish.

You may already have experienced King in concert. He's the bass player with Buck Harms and Country Pride, a mainstay on the local music

"Just Me" is an appropriate title for this album, because King plays all of the instruments — including guitar, bass and keyboards, as well as all the singing. He also used digital sampling to electronically sequence the percussion parts.

But it's the strong songwriting that is the star of this album. The songs are wellcrafted, and will stand on their own even when played solo on an acoustic guitar, which is how King has been performing late-

ly around the Rogue Valley. The album starts out with "Sweet Remedy," which is uptempo musically even though the lyrics are from a favorite country music genre: the love gone-wrong song. The lush synthesized strings and the acoustic guitar solos are reminiscent of Glenn Campbell. Also, "Sweet Remedy" is one of the most slickly-produced songs on the album.

Next comes "Fire Down Below," which features a catchy riff on the electric guitar and has a certain Johnny Cash feeling to it.

Track number three, "Drive That Woman Outta My Mind," is my favorite on the CD. From the catchy opening guitar riff, this toe-tapper is a delight. The lyrics are clever and — surprise, surprise — it's a love-gone-wrong song.

(What happens when you play a country music record backward? The singer gets his woman back and his dog comes back to life!)

I love the catch line at the end of each verse, "I can't wait to make the interstate/I'm gonna drive that woman outta my mind." Also, the guitar duet in the middle of the song, where King plays both guitar lines, is deceptive because it sounds simple but isn't. The good ones always make it look easy. King told me he wrote this song back in the 1970s, but it stands the test of time.
"Try Love Again," comes

next — it's a good dance tune, if a bit forgettable. The ballad "Lovelight" then flows into "Sunday Dreamin'," an upbeat dance tune that effectively uses King's acoustic guitar against the backdrop of a harddriving drum line.

"Bus to Colorado" follows. It gets off to a rocky start, but picks up steam. By the time it ends, it's one of the best songs on the album. Three more songs round out the album.

King, who recently retired from Ray's Food Place grocery store, produced the album at his home studio. The CD is available at Listen Here in downtown Grants Pass and at Larry's Music on the Grants Pass Parkway. The CD and digital downloads are available online at cdbaby.com/cd/philking, and downloads of the songs from "Just Me" are available at iTunes.
